SPRINGFIELD CARDINALS (31-30)

RHP DAN DENHAM (4-5, 3.02 ERA) vs. RHP MARK MCCORMICK (0-0, 3.00 ERA)

TONIGHT'S GAME: The Springfield Cardinals continue their last home stand of the first half, with game two of the eight-game home stand at Hammons Field. This is game two against Arkansas, while Northwest Arkansas will head to Hammons Field on Thursday. Today is 2008 Springfield Cardinals Team Poster Giveaway for 1,500 fans, thanks to Chick-Fil-A. Game time is 7:10pm and gates open at 6:10pm. Individual tickets are available for all regular season home games at Hammons Field by calling (417) 863-2143 or online at www.springfieldcardinals.com.

VS. THE TRAVS: This is the tenth meeting between these two clubs and the second series at Hammons Field. The Cards are 4-1 vs the Travs here at home, but just 4-5 overall, after they dropped all four in Arkansas in their only series in North Little Rock thus far.

MARK MCCORMICK: Making just his fifth start for Springfield and first against Arkansas...in last start, allowed three runs on three hits (all solo homers) in a no-decision vs Corpus Christi on 6/2...was called up in mid-May from Palm Beach, where he went 0-1 with an ERA of 2.43 in ten games (five starts) with the Palm Beach Cardinals of the Florida State League...was injured most of 2007 and has only made 28 appearances in his first three years of pro ball coming into 2008...played college ball at Baylor...originally drafted by STL in the supplemental first round (43rd overall) in 2005...**DAN DENHAM:** Making his 11th start of the year and third against Springfield...in two prior outings vs the Cards, is 1-1, allowing six runs on 16 hits over 12 2/3 innings...in last start, allowed three runs on seven hits over seven innings in loss to Northwest Arkansas on 6/4...in 2007, split time with the Cincinnati and Oakland, pitching for Sarasota of the Florida State League (3-1, 4.60 ERA, 12 G), Stockton of the Cal League (1-0, 11.25, 4 G) and Midland of the Texas League (1-1, 4.86, 12 G)...signed as a free agent earlier this year with the Angels...originally drafted by Cleveland in the first round (17th overall) in the 2001 June Draft.

LAST GAME: Tyler Greene's three-run walk-off home run gave the Cardinals their seventh straight win, a 9-7 victory in ten innings over the Arkansas Travelers. Greene's eighth homer of the year came off of Arkansas reliever Stephen Marek (1-3). The Cardinals were trailing going into the bottom of the tenth, thanks to Brian Stavisky's solo home run in the top of the tenth off eventual winner Jonathan Mikrut (2-2). Jon Jay hit a game-tying two-run home run in the bottom of the ninth inning with two outs, forcing extra innings, his seventh of the year.

CLEMENT TO START AGAIN: Matt Clement, who threw five innings in Sunday's game against Arkansas, is now scheduled to throw again on Friday vs Northwest Arkansas. Clement allowed six runs (three earned) on seven hits, throwing 75 pitches vs the Travs on Sunday. The right-hander, who had shoulder surgery in 2006 and didn't pitch in 2007, has not yet worked for the St. Louis Cardinals at the big-league level, after signing a free agent contract with the Redbirds in the off-season. CRAIG AND MARTINEZ BOTH STRUGGLING: Springfield's Allen Craig is 0 for his last 18 in his past four games. Craig hasn't homered since May 25th and has recorded only two RBIs since the 25th. Despite that, he still leads the club with 11 homers and 40 RBIs. Jose Martinez is also slumping with just two hits in his last 31 at-bats. He did have a key two-out infield single in last night's tenth inning, helping to set the table for Tyler Greene's dramatic walk-off homer.

ROBINSON TIES JAY AT 12: Shane Robinson went just 1-5 last night, but extended his hitting streak to 12 straight. Robinson is still leading the circuit with a .382 average, 18 points higher than the next closest man, Frisco's Max Ramirez (.364). Robinson ties Jon Jay for the longest hitting streak this year. The longest hitting streak in franchise history is held by Aaron Herr, as he hit in 15 straight back in 2005.

JAY COLLECTS HARDWARE: The Texas League announced today that Jon Jay has been named Texas League Player of the Week. Jay batted an even .500 last week, going 12-24 in six games. Jay hit two home runs, both of which were game-tying homers. He also drove in five runs in his six games. Taking Pitcher of the Week Honors was Northwest Arkansas right-hander Blake Wood, who fired a nine-inning, three-hit shut-out against Arkansas, striking out ten men without surrendering a walk. Jay is already the fifth Cardinal to be honored this year with a Texas League award.

A MESS AT THE TOP...BUT A GOOD MESS: Thanks to a season-high seven-game winning streak, the Springfield Cardinals are now tied for first place. Entering tonight's game, Arkansas, Northwest Arkansas and Springfield all have identical marks of 31-30, with just nine games to go in the first half. Of Springfield's nine remaining first-half games, four are against division-leading Northwest Arkansas and five are against second-place Arkansas, including the final two in North Little Rock against the Travs. The winner of the First Half North Division will get home field advantage in the first round of the Texas League Playoffs.

ALL-STARS ANNOUNCED: Texas League All-Stars were announced today by the league office, as seven Springfield Cardinals have made the cut, including three in the starting lineup. OF Shane Robinson, SS Tyler Greene and 3B Allen Craig have all been given the starting nod for the Cards, while Brandon Yarbrough will be the reserve catcher and Jon Jay will be a reserve outfielder. Pitchers Jess Todd and Fernando Salas were also both selected to throw for the North Division. Northwest Arkansas matched Springfield with seven, while Tulsa had six and Arkansas had four. Frisco had a league-best total of eight All-Stars selected to the South Division team. The 2008 Texas League All-Star Game presented by Great Southern will take place at Hammons Field on Wednesday, June 25th.

DO THE DEW: The Cardinals have finally made a roster move to replace Clayton Mortensen, who was promoted to Triple-A Memphis on Friday. Right-hander Josh Dew, who made nine appearances for Springfield after a late-April call-up, will again work out of the Springfield bullpen. Dew, who was 0-2 with a 6.30 ERA in nine games for Springfield, was 3-1 with five saves in a total of 21 relief appearances for Palm Beach, sporting just a 1.73 ERA.

MEMPHIS REPORT: The Memphis Redbirds (32-32) got strong pitching from Jaime Garcia yesterday, downing the Round Rock Express by a score of 4-2. Garcia (3-2) allowed just one run on eight hits over 6 2/3 innings, striking out six and walking two. Cody Haerther had two hits and three RBIs for the Redbirds, who are still four games back of division-leading Iowa.

FUTURE ANGELS IN ARKANSAS: The Los Angeles Angels of Anaheim have only three prospects in Arkansas which Baseball America considers to be in the top 30 Angels prospects overall. They include #6 RHP Stephen Marek, #11 INF Hainley Statia and #19 OF Chris Pettit.
